SUBJECT: Construction Contract for the Bayshore Bus Stop Improvement Project

DATE: July 23, 2012

City Council Goals:

To promote transportation opportunities that maximize safety, reliability, enhance circulation and create options thereby reducing reliance on the use of the automobile. (#5)

Purpose:

To award a contract utilizing grant funds to improve the existing bus stop south of the 7 Mile House; this action is consistent with the community's environmentally progressive values, as it is expected to lead to an increased use of transit.

Recommendation:

Award the construction contract for the Bayshore Bus Stop Improvement Project #9C01 to Interstate Grading and Paving in the amount of \$106,480, and authorize the City Manager to sign the Agreement on behalf of the City.

Background:

On June 18, Council approved the plans and specifications and authorized publication of the Notice Inviting Bids for the Bayshore Bus Stop Improvement Project. Per a Cooperative Agreement with Daly City previously approved by Council, Daly City will pass through construction funding to be received from the San Mateo County Transit District (Samtrans) as the primary project applicant.

Discussion:

The City received the following bids on July 17, 2012:

Interstate Grading and Paving	\$ 106,480
O'Grady Paving	\$ 169,950
Engineer's Estimate	\$ 182,000

Staff reviewed the apparent low bid and determined that the proposal was responsive and the bidder was responsible.


Fiscal Impact:

The cost of construction for this project is fully funded by Prop 1B Lifeline Transportation Program grant funds and State Transit Assistance allocation.

Paragraph 3 of the Cooperative Agreement specifies the requirements for Daly City to deposit the funds for the construction contract with Brisbane. Staff recommends the Council authorize the City Manager to award the construction contract once he is satisfied the terms of the Cooperative Agreement have been met.

Measure of Success


