## PROCLAMATION

### A PROCLAMATION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRISBANE RECOGNIZING SEPTEMBER 2009 AS NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS MONTH

**WHEREAS**, President Obama has continued the tradition started in 2004 of declaring September as National Preparedness Month to increase public awareness about emergency preparedness; and

**WHEREAS**, Department of Homeland Security Secretary Napolitano has stated, “Preparedness is a shared responsibility that begins with the American people”; and

**WHEREAS**, Federal Emergency Management Agency Administrator Fugate has stated, “Emergency response is a team effort, and the most important member of that team is the public”; and

**WHEREAS**, the citizens of Brisbane can prepare themselves by:

- Making a family emergency plan
- Becoming informed about different emergencies that may affect them
- Getting involved in community preparedness and response efforts; and
