City Council Goals:

To develop recreational facilities and promote recreation, educational and cultural programs and passive uses related to parks. (#6)

To promote intergovernmental opportunities that enhances services and/or reduces cost of operations and services to city residents. (#10)

Purpose:

To obtain grant funding for a non-motorized boating facility proposed to be installed at the Marina. Obtaining grant funds is consistent with the community's value of being fiscally conservative.

Recommendation:

Approve Resolution No. 2015-06, "A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Brisbane Authorizing an Application for Non-Motorized Boating Facility Grant Funding with the State of California."

Background:

Staff has been researching the possibility of installing a non-motorized boating facility (also commonly referred to as a "hand-launch" facility) for the past two years. If available, staff expects that the facility would attract kayakers, windsurfers, paddle boarders and sailors of small vessels such as an FJ sailboat.

The challenge in obtaining grant funding has been that a preliminary design was a required component of an application. As part of our ongoing research into this issue, staff had scheduled a meeting with Anchor QEA on 1/26/15 to discuss a possible scope to develop the preliminary design. At that meeting, Anchor advised that their pre-meeting

research had discovered that the current program for such a facility was undersubscribed, and that applications for the next round of funding were due 2/2/15.

Based on staff's expectation that receipt of such a grant would be well-received, Anchor was authorized to spend no more than \$10,000 to develop an application in time to meet the due date (see Attachments). Due to the program being undersubscribed, Division of Boating and Waterways (DBW) staff allowed the application to be submitted without the required Council Resolution, with the understanding that staff would schedule the Resolution for Council consideration at its 3/5/15 meeting.

Discussion:

If the Council declines to pass the proposed Resolution, staff will so notify DBW and the previously submitted application will be withdrawn.

It is important to note that while the initial application was clearly rushed to meet a looming deadline, the project schedule (see "Supplement" section to application) incudes 60 days for public outreach. Staff expects that both the Parks & Recreation Commission and the Sierra Point Yacht Club will be engaged to obtain input prior to completing a final design.

Fiscal Impact:

The not to exceed fee of \$10,000 for development of the application has been authorized from existing marina funds. The requested amount of \$635,000 for the facility would be a 100% no-match grant. Attachment B to the Application shows a "proposed picnicking area" adjacent to the launch facility. No funds have been identified for this improvement; staff estimates that this work could be completed for approximately \$25,000.

Measure of Success

The construction of a hand-launch facility near our existing marina to serve the needs of non-motorized recreational mariners.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Brisbane as follows:



Dear Mr. Dux,

The city is excited about the opportunity to receive grant funding for the referenced facility. Although we operate a Fisherman's Park (at the Brisbane Lagoon, just west of US 101), a Fisherman's Pier (due north of the Sierra Point landmass), as well as the Brisbane Marina, there are no opportunities for hand-launching small vessels such as kayaks, windsurfers, paddle boarders, or FJ sailboats within the city limits

The site proposed for our facility was previously identified as San Mateo site 22 in the San Francisco Bay Area Water Trail. Incorrectly shown in that document as an existing facility, we are anxious to install a water trailhead across the existing rip-rap barrier to provide Bay access to an underserved group of recreational mariners.

Brisbane is a small city with a population of less than 4,000. We do require our Marina to be completely self-funded; based on that requirement and the slip berth rate increases anticipated to pay for a \$3.9M dredging project planned for 2015-2016, we do not expect the marina will be able to provide funds for the design and installation of the hand-launch facility. However, we are committed to paying for the long-term maintenance and upkeep associated with ownership of a new facility.

INTRODUCTION

The information in this memorandum, including incorporated schedule and attached figures, supplement the City of Brisbane's (City's) application for a Non-Motorized Boating Facility Grant. Currently, there is no safe and easily accessible hand-carried boat launching access at the City's marina. In addition, the City has safety concerns with unauthorized access over the existing rock armored slope. The proposed project would create safe and efficient public access for hand-carried boat launching of non-motorized craft, including Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) access for the launching area, as well as improve upland park facilities adjacent to the launch area. The City intends to improve the Bay trail and public amenities adjacent to the launch ramp, including adding a picnic area adjacent to it. The existing Bay trail is a regional multi-use trail system around San Francisco Bay that is ADA accessible. An existing ADA accessible restroom is located within a very short walking distance as well. The following information is cross-referenced to the enclosed application form.

There would be widespread public support for this project. Currently, there is not safe and easily accessible hand-carried boat launching access at Brisbane Marina. In addition, the City has safety concerns with unauthorized access over the existing rock armored slope. The proposed project would create safe and efficient public access for hand-carried boat launching of non-motorized craft, including ADA access for the launching area, as well as improve upland park facilities adjacent to the launch area. The City intends to improve the Bay trail and public amenities adjacent to the launch ramp, including adding a picnic area adjacent to it. The existing Bay trail is a regional multi-use trail system around San Francisco Bay that is ADA accessible. An existing ADA accessible restroom is located within a very short walking distance as well.

12. Describe the problem the proposed project will solve. For example, does the project fix or address a health, access, or safety issue for users at the facility?

The proposed facility directly addresses two goals of the City and needs for the general public: (1) create a safe and efficient hand-launch facility along the City's shoreline, to improve public access and marine recreation for residents and visitors; and (2) by doing so, reduce or eliminate issues related to unsafe and unauthorized access to the Bay, by residents and visitors, which is a current problem. Brisbane Marina lacks a free, public hand-launch facility at the shoreline, and this facility would integrate well to the existing marina, ADA accessible public restrooms, and Bay trail.

13. Describe the scope of the project to be financed with DBW funding.

A new non-motorized vessel launch facility is proposed to be constructed in the Oyster Point Channel, adjacent to the City of Brisbane public marina. The current site is one of the stops along the San Francisco Bay Water Trail and has an existing ADA accessible restroom, public trail, picnic and grass areas, and a parking lot immediately adjoining the proposed project site. For the non-motorized launch facility, new construction will include: (1) a 60-foot-long by 16-foot-wide low-profile dock; (2) a 6-foot-wide by 80-foot-long ADA aluminum gangway; (3) a 12-feet-by-16-feet reinforced concrete gangway platform; (4) platform aluminum railing and signage; (5) three 18-inch diameter concrete guide piles; (6) information and directional signage; and (7) a 120-foot-long vertical groin wall constructed of steel sheet piles with cap. No new utilities are needed, and existing site lighting should provide adequate coverage of the new dock.

In addition to the proposed grant funded items, the City will independently fund and improve landside improvements, including the following:

- Striping for two ADA compliant parking spaces in existing parking lot
- Development of an improved picnic area, including plantings, seating, and a barbecue pit
- Improved trail access and grading

The estimated City investment, applying similar markups and contingencies, is approximately \$45,000 of non-grant funds. These overall improvements are shown in Attachment B.

14. Describe the types of boating done at the proposed facility/improvements.

The existing marina includes permanent wet slips for a variety of sail and power boats. It does not include any public hand-launching area for non-motorized craft, which would be provided by the proposed facility. Non-motorized uses, such as kayaking, are popular in the vicinity of the marina.

15. Describe the importance or significance of the proposed project.

Brisbane Marina lacks a free, public hand-launch facility at the shoreline, and this facility would integrate well to the existing marina, ADA accessible public restrooms, and Bay trail. The City is excited for the opportunity to create more and better public recreational opportunities at the shoreline, and believes that this facility is an important piece of this long-term plan. Constructing this facility will invite more use of the waterfront by City residents and visitors, and thereby hopefully also stimulate economic development as well as improve the safety of people using non-motorized craft by providing a launching facility on the Brisbane shoreline.

16. Has local law enforcement (sheriff/marine patrol) been consulted to ensure the proposed facility meets the needs for water rescue?

Yes. The Brisbane Harbormaster's office has been consulted regarding this project. The Brisbane Police Department exercises law enforcement authority at the marina and the proposed location for this project. The proposed project area is already patrolled by the local police department, and having this facility is likely to reduce issues with unauthorized access to the Bay and improve public safety overall.

29. (a) What are the public benefits of the project?

The proposed facility directly addresses two goals of the City and needs for the general public: (1) create a safe and efficient hand-launch facility along the City's shoreline, to improve public access and marine recreation for residents and visitors; and (2) by doing so, reduce or eliminate issues related to unsafe and unauthorized access to the Bay, by residents and visitors, which is a current problem. Brisbane Marina lacks a free, public hand-launch facility at the shoreline, and this facility would integrate well to the existing marina, ADA accessible public restrooms, and Bay trail.

31. (a) Does the project benefit underserved populations?

Yes. The facility will be free and open to the public. Therefore, underserved or low-income populations will benefit from this amenity.

(b) Will the project provide economic benefit to the local area?

Yes. The project will provide opportunities for sales of recreational equipment, food, and other services, that could be utilized by local residents and visitors.

(c) Will the project attract users from outside the immediate area?

The facility will also likely attract visitors from outside the area who seek to use a free public hand-launch facility to access the Bay.

(d) How would the proposed project promote non-motorized boating?

The proposed project promotes non-motorized boating by providing a new, safe, free hand-launch facility for City residents and visitors from surrounding communities.




Figure 2 Proposed Plan Proposed Hand-Launching Access City of Brisbane
