Subject: Construction Contract for Safe Routes to Schools/Green Infrastructure Project (No. 9105)

Community Goal/Result

Safe Community, Ecological Sustainability

Purpose

Improve pedestrian safety and comfort in Central Brisbane along designated Safe Routes to Schools while providing stormwater treatment benefits and enhancement of streetscape aesthetics.

Recommendation

Award the construction contract for the Safe Routes to Schools/Green Infrastructure Project to Kingdom Pipelines, Inc. in the amount of \$ 625,576, and authorize the Mayor to sign the Agreement on behalf of the City.

Background

The Safe Routes to Schools/Green Infrastructure Project will include clearing sidewalk obstructions, improving street crossings, installing new signage and striping, and installing new landscaped bioretention basin curb extensions known as green infrastructure (GI). GI will require removal of a few parking spaces. Adjacent impacted property owners have been contacted. Improvements will be made along the designated Safe Routes to Schools at various locations including within downtown Brisbane and near Brisbane Elementary School and Lipman Middle School. The City advertised the project on February 6 as authorized by the Director of Public Works.

The City received one bid on February 27, 2020:

Kingdom Pipelines Inc.

\$ 625,576.00

Staff reviewed the apparent low bid and determined that the proposal was responsive and the bidder was responsible. Impacts to pedestrians and the motoring public will be minimal during construction, which is expected to occur in late April through June of 2020.

Fiscal Impact

The project utilized consultant services costing \$84,500 for the design of the green infrastructure components. Combined design and construction costs are \$710,076.

Funds are available from three sources:


- \$245,263 in grant funds awarded from the San Mateo City/County Association of Governments (C/CAG) Safe Routes to School and Green Streets Infrastructure Pilot Program.
- \$364,813 in previous annual Measure A sales tax and California state gas tax revenues
- \$100,000 for Safe Routes infrastructure improvements, funded by Council in the 2018-2020 budget in Fund 100-6005.
