San Mateo County Libraries Go Fine-Free!

Growing a Culture of Learning and Participation



San Mateo County Libraries are kicking off the new year by eliminating all fines! Starting January 7th, the library system is going fine-free to ensure that all members of our community have equitable access to library books and materials.

Studies have shown that late fines can be a significant barrier to library access and drive borrowers away, particularly among individuals with low or fixed incomes. Currently, 8% of all San Mateo County Libraries' 165,000 cardholders currently have their cards blocked due to fines. In our lower income communities, the number can be as high as 19%. Furthermore, the growing research has shown that fines do not actually incentivize patrons to return materials on time.

"It's important to be thoughtful about punitive measures like overdue fines. When we look at the data, it turns out they aren't effective. At the end of the day, we want to get as many books as possible into the hands of as many readers as possible," said Charles Stone, Library JPA Governing Board Chair. "This is a proud moment for all of us at San Mateo County Libraries as we continue to look for better ways to serve our community through innovative solutions and progressive policies."

The new policy builds upon previous successful initiatives implemented by San Mateo County Libraries. In July 2016, the Libraries introduced fine-free library cards for children and teens and last January, launched fine-free library cards for seniors age 62 and older.

Eliminating late fines is becoming a national trend as more and more libraries across the country are taking the leap to go fine-free. Libraries that have moved to a more customer focused policy have reported that the elimination of fines results in higher use, increased customer satisfaction, and positive interactions with the community.





RESIDENT Authors: SPOTLIGHT Tuong Van Do & Kathy Wall

Our "City of Stars" hosts a rich and vivid population of Artists, sharing their talents in town and around the Bay Area. A handful of them will be performing at this month's Artists' Evening of Sharing event at Mission Blue Center. Recently, the Brisbane STAR sat down with local residents Tuong Van Do, who also goes by Van, and Kathy Wall.

Van has served the City on the Planning Commission and Kathy's strong voice can be heard serenading the crowd at many community events, such as the Day in the Park, the Veterans' Flag-Raising Event, and the Festival of Lights. When we heard that they both recently published children's books, we wanted to find out a little bit more...

What are the names of your books and can you give us a brief synopsis?

KW: My first book, "Maggie the Magnolia", was written 28 or so years ago, after I had purchased a little magnolia tree over in the East Bay and carried it across the East Bay in my little red convertible I owned at the time. It was quite a ride! After I planted it in my yard, I thought it might be a good story, so I wrote it down. My second book, "Oscar the Oak", has to do with Maggie's friend Oscar being left behind in the nursery and what happens to him next...



VD: My book is called "Bay and Be's First Lullaby". It's set to the tune of "Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star" and is a story about the uniqueness of being "you" through the eyes of Bay, a little girl, and Be, her twin brother. They're charged with a special responsibility of providing guidance for humankind, with the help of their guardian zo*.

Wow, so Kathy's first book has been "in-the-making" for 28 years. What inspired the both of you to finally put pen to paper?

KW: For me, I suddenly had grandchildren and wanted to share it with them, and secondly, I had a health scare. At that point, I realized it was time to make it happen. Then, came a year plus of hard work editing, finding an illustrator, and figuring how to publish it.

VD: My illustrator was actually my brother (chuckle), which was good and bad. When you have two creative minds come together, you can get into a LOT of back-and-forth with each other, but we at least came out this with a MUCH stronger relationship. As to what inspired me to write it, it's what I've been singing to my children at the end of each day, the oldest of which is 16 and my youngest is 2. I've always had a desire to give children something that would provide joyful closure for their day, something that was a testament of the contributions and choices made throughout the day, with happy inspiration and loving reassurance that, though this day is done, they would wake up to another new day filled with growth and adventure.

That is pretty remarkable, though not too surprising, how the little ones in your lives inspired your works. Did your characters come easily then, and how did you develop them?

KW: For my first book, the characters were pretty simple, because Maggie was a real tree and the only other characters were my sons and our dogs. "Oscar the Oak" was more complicated because I was starting from scratch and had to develop the story and characters.

VD: The characters "Bay" and "Be" came easily and are based upon the natural qualities that make children special: unconditional love, wonder, innocence, transparency, optimism, spontaneity, thankfulness, honesty, resilience, adaptability, and mirth or amusement without measure.

All three of your books sound so fun and inspiring, even for adults! Where can we find a copy of them?

KW: Thank you! Both of my books can be found on Amazon and BarnesandNoble.com, but for local folks, I will happily hand-deliver and save you about \$4/book. Shoot me an email at kathwallwriter@yahoo.com.

Ok, last but not least, do you have any more books in you?



VD: Most definitely.
