There's A New Street Tree on the Block





You may have noticed that the corner of Visitacion @ Monterey when heading up Visitacion looks a bit different. That is due in large part to the removal of the 60' Brisbane Box (Tristania conferta), which Tim Chang and his crew at Humboldt Tree Service completed over the course of a couple days in mid-August. The reason for the tree's removal and replacement with a Chinese Pistache (Pistacia chinesis) was due to the Box's hard, woody capsules (which comprise the tree's "fruit" – similar to what drops from a eucalypt) falling to the sidewalk and posing a potential slipping hazard to pedestrians. The Chinese Pistache, on the other hand, doesn't have these issues, and also tolerates drought conditions, heat, and urban conditions well. This tree will also provide good fall color, as its leaves turn beautiful shades of orange and red. It's actually been described as the "Ugly Duckling" because it turns from an unattractive and misshapen young tree into a magnificent specimen tree. We look forward to seeing it "bloom" into maturity!

Text "511Alert" to 888-777 for Emergency Transportation Alerts from 511

The Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) recently launched the 511 Emergency Alert. 511ALERT provides alerts and advisories about transportation emergencies by text message (SMS) to registered mobile devices. The alert system is powered by Nixle, a recognized leader in mass notification systems and allows 511 to provide alerts and advisories in a reliable manner.

To register your mobile device to receive emergency transportation-related alerts and advisories for the Bay Area:

- Text "511Alert" (no space) to 888-777
- You will receive a response text message confirming your registration.

A reminder that if you haven't yet signed up for SMCAlert, please do so. This is what the City of Brisbane will use to reach you in the event of a major disaster or emergency. Sign up is easy. Just text "94005" to 888-777. Once enrolled, you can login and update your settings on alert type and region.





Broadcast Public Meetings Now Being Live-Streamed on YouTube



Have you ever been in the situation where you intended to tune in for a public meeting at City Hall, but then life got in the way and you forgot to do so? Well, things may have just gotten a little easier with the City now using YouTube for live streaming public meetings. You just need to hit the red SUBSCRIBE button on the City's YouTube channel, www.youtube.com/brisbaneca.

Now, prior to a meeting starting, you'll receive an email notification and/or a notification within YouTube itself. Never miss a live public meeting again! Note: all broadcast meetings are still being archived on the City's YouTube channel as well as the City's website (www.brisbaneca.org/city-government/meetings) and will appear there by the morning following the meeting.

Important Fire Flow Improvements to Brisbane's Water Infrastructure Planned for Fall 2019







The City plans to start construction on Phase 2 of the Fire Main Replacement Project in the Fall of 2019. This project will provide much-needed improvements to our City's aging drinking water infrastructure and will include the replacement of approximately 5,120 linear feet of 6-inch water main with 8- and 10- inch pipe along portions of Annis Road, Harold Road, Kings Road, Margaret Road, and Paul Avenue. We will be installing new main line valves, fire hydrants, and water services (see photos that were taken during Phase 1). The work is critically important to upgrade our water distribution system infrastructure to meet current state codes and replace aging pipes. This multi-phase project is expected to be completed in 2021.

During construction, there will be full-width road closures to facilitate this work. We understand that this will be an inconvenience to the residents in the neighborhood, and to limit this impact we will ensure that normal traffic will be resumed at the end of the each work day. The project will also require temporary water service disruptions. All impacted residents will be provided advanced notice of these closures and disruptions.

The City will host a couple of neighborhood meetings to answer questions from community members affected by this project. We will be advertising these meetings on our weekly email blast, so make sure to sign up by visiting: www.tinyurl.com/blast321

Please plan to attend one of these meetings. We are excited to share the details of this critical work. We want to listen to your questions and concerns, so that we can do as much as possible to minimize the impacts to your neighborhood.
