SUBJECT: Surplus of Public Works Vehicles
DATE: February 22, 2011

City Council Goals:

To develop management and fiscal systems to maximize effectiveness of city services and accountability to Brisbane taxpayers and citizens. (#11)

Purpose:

To comply with the Brisbane Municipal Code which requires an affirmative action from Council before public property can be declared surplus.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends approval of Resolution No. 2011-12.

Discussion:

The vehicles recommended as surplus both meet criteria generally accepted by the Council several years ago for vehicle retirement; that is, they are more than 10 years old, or have more than 100,000 service miles, or have been deemed as not cost effective to repair. Neither of the two vehicles is presently in use, neither vehicle will be immediately replaced.

If the Council does not approve the recommended action then the vehicles will remain in storage in the City Corporation Yard, and there will be no revenue from their sale. The city will be required to maintain current smog inspections for the vehicles if they remain in our inventory.

Fiscal Impact:

There is no cost as a result of approving the recommended action.

Measure of Success


When the vehicles are placed for sale using a sealed bid process and transferred to the high bidder.
