VAN DRIVER

Definition

Under general direction of the Recreation Supervisor, transport recreation participants to and from recreation program activities and City-sponsored events, and do related work as required.

Class Characteristics

This classification is distinguished by its driving requirements and its responsibility for transporting participants of City recreation program activities and City-sponsored events to and from specific destinations.

Examples of Duties (Illustrative Only)

- Transport participants to adult and youth recreation program activities and City-sponsored events.
- Attend training programs to maintain and/or improve job skills.
- Perform other related duties, as assigned.

Qualifications

Knowledge of:

- Laws and regulations pertaining to driver and vehicle safety.
- Occupational hazards and safety practices and procedures related to the work.
- Techniques for dealing with recreation program participants, the public, and City staff in an effective manner.

Skill in:

- Operating a 15-passenger vehicle safely and within laws and regulations.
- Communicating effectively orally and in writing with recreation program participants, the public, and City staff.
- Using maps and other directions to transport recreation program participants.
- Acquiring a general knowledge of departmental policies and procedures.
- Establishing and maintaining cooperative relationships with those contacted during the course of work.
- Taking a proactive approach with customer service issues.
- Working in a safe manner, following City safety practices and procedures and within driver and vehicle laws and regulations.

Education and Experience:

Education: Possession of a high school diploma or GED.

Experience: Minimum of two years increasingly responsible experience in an occupation involving regular, direct public contact. Experience in driving in driving a 15-passenger vehicle with a satisfactory driving record is desirable.

Licenses: Possession of, or the ability to obtain, an appropriate valid California Class "B" Drivers' License with the appropriate passenger endorsement and a satisfactory driving record. Possession of, or the ability to obtain, a medical clearance certificate as required for licensing. Possession of current First Aid and CPR certification.

Working Conditions: The essential duties require the following physical skills and work environment: dexterity to drive a large vehicle; sit for prolonged periods, stand, and walk; vision to read printed materials; hearing and speech to communicate in person and over the telephone; lift up to 50 pounds; mobility to work in a field environment; exposure to outdoors, traffic hazards, and inclement weather; ability to travel to different sites and locations; drive safely to different sites and locations; maintain safe driving record.
