Weather Summary

Lingering smoke and hazy conditions will continue to contribute to poor air quality around the Bay Area today and possibly early Tuesday. A cold front will bring gusty winds, heavy rain and possibly a thunderstorm late Tuesday through Wednesday. Given that Wednesday is a major travel day the passing cold front will most likely impact Bay Area roads. A few lingering showers will be possible early Thanksgiving with a brief break in the afternoon. Another storm system will bring additional rainfall late Thanksgiving into Friday. The rain from these frontal systems will help to improve air quality across the Bay Area.
