- Integrated throughout suggested use areas








HABITAT CONNECTIONS - LOCAL

- From Lagoon to shoreline areas







- Bridges & Trails







AREA 1 Community Oriented

- Separated by rail line
- Historic preservation within civic/cultural land use
- Group use areas
- Community park
- Interpretive center
- Icehouse Hill trail & overlook
- Charter high school
 - Historic preservation
 - Gym
 - Soccer field
 - Adult education
 - Environmental Art
 - Green Technology





AREA 2 Regionally Oriented

- Scenic entry road to Brisbane
- Lagoon habitat shoreline
- Use area with lagoon and city views
- Large regional activity area partially overlooking Bay
 - Bicycle Center or Golf
 Training alternative










AREA 3 **Development Oriented**

TRAIL NETWORK

Develop a network of interconnected trails that link to:

- regional trails,
- transit,
- points of interest and
- the local community

User groups:

- Commuters
- Recreational users
 - Community and Baylands bicyclists and pedestrians
- Long distance bicyclists, including Bay Trail users







GOVERNANCE OF PUBLIC SPACE

Numerous Potential Alternatives:

- Public Agency (City or County)
- Joint Powers Authority
- Private
- Public/Private Partnership
- Non-profit Land Trust
- Local Non-profit Organization

Need Consensus on Objectives:

- Avoid liability issues
- Joint decision making (Board make-up)
- Adequate funding for Op. and Maintenance
- Financial management capabilities and incentives
- Capability to lease to concessionaires, other agencies, non-profits, etc.



FUNDING OF PUBLIC SPACE

Needs

- Initial habitat enhancement and establishment
- Initial Facility improvements
- Revenue Stream to complete
- Ongoing funding for Operation, Maintenance, and Programming



Strategies

- Natural upland habitats
 - Lower cost to establish and maintain
- Revenue generating facilities where possible
- Concessionaire leases
- Leases to non-profit entities
- Joint powers with school district
- Baylands Assessment district
- Earmark portion of transit occupancy tax

Habitat Enhancement/ Open Space

- ~215-acre network
- Unifying feature
- Constructed marshes, wetlands and upland habitat, and enhanced habitat on Icehouse Hill
- Connections within site and to adjacent natural areas





2. Recreational/ Public Space Use Areas

- Approximately 57 acres
- community serving and regional recreation uses
- West of Caltrain line:
 - Charter HighSchool/CommunityUse Area
 - Interpretive Center
 - Community Park
 - Group Area
- Easterly of the Caltrain line
 Regional Use Area



3. Public/Private Space Use Areas

- 112 acres
- Transitional between the public space and the development
- Should incorporate native landscaping and public elements such as plazas and trails
- Specific Public/Private
 Use Areas include:
 - Park Concession (near lagoon)
 - Civic-Cultural Envelope (adjacent to roundhouse)
 - Green Development Center







4. Trails

- Robust, interconnected trail network
- Pedestrians and multiple bicycle users (commuters, recreational, local, regional)
- Linking the community, points of interest, transit, and regional trails





5. Lagoon

- Visual and wildlife resource
- Potential for boardwalk bike and pedestrian trail along eastern edge





6. Additional Elements

- Visitacion Creek
 Corridor Parkway
- Enhanced Entry Drive to City
- Themes of environmental art and sustainability





7. Governance,Economics,Operations& Maintenance

- Revenue generating elements
- Leases
- Natural upland habitats
- Creative methods for governance
- Other non-profit models should be explored
- Income streams
