General Department Statement

NOTICE TO VICTIMS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

The Brisbane Police Department is committed to assisting victims of domestic violence. In order to serve you to the best of our ability, we have developed a written standard for our officers to follow and this supplemental guideline for you. Our goal is to ensure that your rights under the law are protected.

The following terms are defined to assist you in exercising your rights as a victim of domestic violence.

- 1) **Domestic Violence** is abuse committed against an adult or fully emancipated minor who is a spouse, former spouse, cohabitant, or person who has had a child or a dating engagement relationship.
- 2) <u>Abuse</u> means intentionally or recklessly causing or attempting to cause bodily injury, or placing another person in reasonable apprehension of imminent serious bodily injury to himself, or another.
- 3) A <u>Felony Arrest</u> can be made by a police officer when he/she has reasonable cause to believe a felony has occurred. Whether or not a person will be arrested for a felony will be determined by the responding officer.
- 4) A <u>Misdemeanor Arrest</u> can be made by either a police officer of a person like yourself. A police officer can make a misdemeanor arrest when the officer has reasonable cause to believe a misdemeanor has occurred in the officer's presence. In some instances of domestic assault or battery, a police officer can make a misdemeanor arrest when the officer has probable cause to believe a misdemeanor has occurred, even though the domestic assault/battery did not occur in his/her presence. A person can make a "Citizen's Arrest" when a misdemeanor has in fact occurred in that person's presence.
- 5) A <u>Restraining Order</u> is a civil court order issued by a judge that prohibits the conduct of an individual.
- 6) A <u>Stay-Away Order</u> is a criminal or civil court order issued by a judge that directs or prohibits a person from being near another person, and or certain premises or locations.

- 7) An <u>Emergency Protective Order (EPO)</u> is a court order issued by a judge over the phone that affords a person immediate legal protection from another person. The order directs or prohibits a person from being near another person, certain premises or locations, and may order temporary custody of involved children. The EPO is good for 5 business days allowing you time to apply for a Restraining Order.
- 8) Violation of a Restraining Order or Stay-Away Order is a misdemeanor.
- 9) The Cite and Release process takes place when a misdemeanor has occurred. The officer must issue a citation and release the person except under certain circumstances (i.e., the officer believes the criminal or prohibited conduct will continue). This process is like getting a ticket.

If a person is taken to jail, that person may be released within a few hours, either by posting bail or by "promising to appear" at a future hearing (this is called <u>Own</u> <u>Recognizance</u>, O.R.).

Note: If a person is arrested and later released, the police department will notify you <u>if you request</u> such notification at the time of the arrest or within a short time period.

PROCEDURES

If you are a victim of domestic violence, the responding officer will write a police report. The suspect may be subject to arrest. Our officer will arrest if: 1) A felony has just occurred; 2) If the officer witnesses a misdemeanor offense; 3) If the officer has probable cause to believe that a misdemeanor domestic assault or battery has occurred; 3) if the officer agrees that you are the victim of a misdemeanor and you wish to make a "citizen's arrest." A "citizen's arrest" requires that you tell the abusing person, "I am placing you under arrest."

It is important to tell the officer if the suspect has abused you in the past, or has threatened you and you believe the abuse will continue after the police leave. This information will help the officer decide whether to take the suspect to jail or cite and release him/her.

If you believe the suspect in this case may either harass you, cause further injury to you, or damage your property, we strongly advise you obtain a Stay-Away or Restraining Order. These orders would prohibit further contact between the suspect and you, and your property.

If the suspect is charged with a crime, a Stay Away Order may be issued upon your request or the request of the Deputy District Attorney during the criminal procedure. The judge will order the suspect not to harass you. This order stays in effect as long as the suspect is under the jurisdiction of the court. This includes any sentence or probationary period.

Restraining Orders may be issued by a Civil Court. Most Restraining Orders prohibit the suspect from contacting you (in person or by telephone) at your home or work place, and prohibit the person from removing or tampering with your property.

If you wish to request a Restraining Order you should contact your personal attorney. If you don't have an attorney and cannot afford one, you may file your own papers by requesting an order at the County Clerks Office. You may also obtain forms and instructions by calling Legal Aid at (650) 365-8411. The Woman's Shelter (650 342-0850) offers assistance in obtaining Restraining orders and holds clinics on how to file them. The Count Clerk requires a filing fee, but such fees may be waived if you cannot afford it.

Domestic Violence is a crime and will be handled by our officers accordingly. We are available to answer your questions 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Please feel free to call us as (415) 508-2181.
